
In maths, we have been revising what we know about **fractions**, multiplication and division. In English, we have been reading the

Maths Growth Mindset Week 29 April - 3rd May 2024

During the maths growth mindset week in the school, pupils learned to believe in their maths abilities. They understood that their intelligence in maths grows when they put effort in solving maths problems. The pupils learned not to give up in maths lesson but to use strategies that are available to them in the classroom to work out maths challenges. We took maths out of the classroom to outdoor to encourage pupils' to use their growth mindset and be able to see maths in the real world.







Pupils were happy to make connections with maths in nature and the world around them. They reasoned about maths problems while measuring with units and non-units of measurement in the park. They identified and reasoned about patterns, shapes, and angles they identified on trees and buildings. They reasoned about cost of their favourite treats and how to calculate their change. These creative activities boosted their confidence in maths and helped them to view maths as a fun and creative subject that is enjoyable to learn.
