FROM AROUND THE SCHOOL

CLASS 6T


Last week we had a visit from the **Metropolitan Police** who held a talk with year 6 about **keeping safe online**. The children were very engaged and learnt **the importance of not sharing private details over the internet**.

In our **RE lessons**, we are focusing on **'Pentecost'** and the effect the **Holy Spirit** had on **the disciples**. We wrote a recount and prayers for a display. In **art** we are making stained **glassed windows** to include the Pentecost theme.

In science we have started our topic of evolution and inheritance. We are first looking out fossils and how they are made. We have been thinking about what they tell us about the past. In this subject, we will look at how creatures adapt to their environments to survive.





For science, we have been finding out about **'Animals Including Humans'.** We found out that there was a difference between the **teeth** of a carnivore,

herbivore and omnivore which was fascinating. We also looked at human teeth and the differences between canines, incisors and molars. We found out that we use our

canines to help us break down meat and our incisors to bite into hard foods like an apple. Our molars are used to grind



down our food into smaller pieces allowing us to swallow it.

NURSERY

This term our theme is **Transport** and we will be using lots of good quality texts to explore this including a very humorous book called **Naughty Bus** about a very mischievous London bus that makes trouble. We will continue to follow **Ruth Miskins's Read, Write, Inc phonics.** Your children will have the opportunity to apply their phonics in writing and to **practise writing their names independently**. In **Maths** we will be looking at **counting to 5, 10 and 20,** making comparisons, solving practical problems in play and meaningful activities, patterns, shape and space and measures. The children will **learn new nursery rhymes and songs** and participate in lots of **messy Arts and Crafts** including **3D 'junk' modelling, painting, collage and clay.** In **RE** we will be focussing on **Bible stories and songs about Jesus.** In **PD** we will continue to find out about the **importance of exercise** and play fun running games about different modes of transport and use different sized balls to help with our fine motor skills.

Please remember that Nursery children need to come in wearing the correct PE kit on Wednesdays.
