MATHS

This term children will be learning about:

Counting and Cardinality: We will be learning rhymes to count in 2s, 5s, and 10s.

Composition: We will work on number bonds and learn to know which pairs make a given number.

Comparison: Find half of an object or number.

Patterns: Explore tessellating and symmetrical patterns.

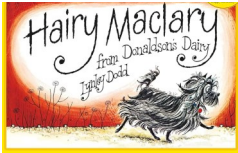


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

In RE we will be introducing the topic 'The Church'. The children will learn that the Church is the family of God and we all belong to it. They will learn about the significance of the church, that it is a holy building and we can go to pray there. Jesus is present in a special way in the tabernacle and we can go visit him there at church.



LITERACY



Throughout this term we will be reading 'Hairy Maclary', by Lynley Do. We will role play scenarios of different family members in the story and freeze

frame events. The children will write speech bubbles in role of a chosen character and also explore saying and writing sentences using different tenses.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Children will participate in daily mindfulness activities and understand strategies to use to maintain a healthy mind. We will build on previous skills taught about emotions and make links to how the children might be feeling making the transition from reception class to year 1. We will continue to work on co-operative play and encouraging children to take turns and work purposely in group activities.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGN

Art: This term we will be using recycled materials to create model homes and churches. We will be labelling our buildings and talking about their purpose. Children will have the opportunity to create their own self portrait.

Children will also continue to explore mixing paint colours for a purpose. They will use a range of tools to design and create their own representations. eg Using clay and recycled materials.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

Children will be encouraged to ask questions to find out more information. They will also be encouraged to use talk to help work out problems, organise thinking and activities, and to explain how things work and why they might happen. Children will experience listening to and talking about selected fiction and non-fiction texts to develop a deep familiarity with new knowledge and vocabulary.

Music: Make choices about sounds to accompany a story. Talk about how different tones of music make them feel.



We will also be reading 'Oi Frog', by Kes Gray. The children will build on their understanding of simple sentence structure and continue to practise writing their own captions and sentences. They will further develop their knowledge on what is a question and learn about suffixes.

They will also match rhyming pairs in the story and think of their own.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

This term's focus is on health and fitness. Children will learn about ways to develop a healthy body.

Gymnastics: Children will explore making different shapes with their bodies and work on balance and co-ordination. They will use a range of equipment to develop their skills.

Dance: Children will learn to initiate new combinations of movement and gesture in order to express and respond to feelings, ideas and experiences.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

During topic work children will be exploring different materials and they will watch videos and read information books to develop their knowledge. They will identify similarities and differences between different materials and take part in experiments to understand how materials change. The children will learn about different families and discuss the different stages of life they themselves have experienced as they have grown from babies to their current age.
